While we still have a month left in the calendar year, the beginning of Advent also signals the start of a new liturgical year, the cycle of feasts and celebrations by which we enter ever more deeply into the mystery of Christ. Rather than letting these weeks slip by, we ought to avail ourselves of every grace they offer. Here are some suggestions:

- Spend a few minutes each day reading Scripture. One fine resource is *The Magnificat Advent Companion*, copies of which are available in the narthex. There are also several websites through which one may receive the daily readings via email.
- Mark the days of Advent using an Advent calendar.
- Come to weekday Mass. Mass is celebrated in the chapel on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at 6:30am; Wednesday at 5:15pm; and Saturday at 8:00am.
- Advent is an excellent time to receive the sacrament of Penance. If it's been awhile, there's no better time than the present — and no better present to give yourself. Confessions are heard each Saturday from 4:00 to 4:45pm; we will also take part again in **Reconciliation Monday** on December 19. On that day, priests in every parish in the Archdiocese of New York will hear confessions from 4:00 to 8:00pm. Fr. Jeff and I are also happy to make appointments with those who prefer another time.
- Consider spending an hour of your week in prayer before the Lord on the first Friday of the month. Eucharistic adoration will begin on Friday, December 2 following the 6:30am Mass, and conclude the following morning just before the 8:00am Mass. We'll also be taking part in the National Night of Prayer for Life on December 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. More on that next week.

If you're looking for something new by way of Christmas gifts, may I offer three suggestions?

- MonasteryGreetings.com is a wonderful website that carries items from countless monasteries and convents around the country (even some items from overseas). The sale of these goods is the main means of support for many of these communities. For example, the monks of Spencer Abbey, where I go on retreat each year, make the well-known Trappist Preserves from scratch. More recently, they've started making beer (I can highly recommend the feierabendbier). Both are available at Monastery Greetings.
- If you're looking for genuine *Christmas* cards with tasteful and elegant religious art and Scripture verses, look no further than The Printery House, an apostolate of Conception Abbey in Missouri. Visit printeryhouse.org.
- If you're looking for religious reading, a crucifix, or anything St. Thérèse, The National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Middletown has a very nice bookstore and gift shop. The shrine is just off Wawayanda Avenue, not far from OCC.

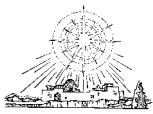

Christians, Sunday, the Lord's Day, is a special day consecrated to the service and the worship of God. It is a unique Christian Festival." Historically, this has always been true, but "as we look at our fellow Christians and our society, we observe that everyone is short of time and stressed. One reason is that many of us have forgotten the meaning of Sunday and with it the practices that regularly renewed our relationships and lives...Sunday has become less a day of worship and family and more like an ordinary work day. Shopping, sports and work squeeze out the chance for a day of worship or rest in the Christian sense...Sunday is more than just the first day of the week. In our faith we see how it is the ultimate day of new beginnings..."

In a society in which Black Friday begins early on Thanksgiving night, it would be unrealistic to believe that we will ever return to that day when only the small deli or pharmacy would be open for last-minute emergencies. But it is possible that we can influence others by our witnessing to the importance of religious experience and family living by our changing focus where necessary. Unfortunately, we must attest to realities of our lives in which certain activities are required. But they should be the exception and not the rule. Sunday dinner together should be a requirement in which no one is in a rush to become a zombie for the NFL. In the Archdiocese of New York, there are so many places of significance to visit: museums, parks, and theatres. Did your family ever visit Ellis Island? Have you ever been to the Marian Shrine in Haverstraw? What about going to the Walkway over the Hudson? How empty our lives are, if we only know where the malls are.

Fr. George Rutler, the well-known author and commentator (and pastor of St. Michael's Church on West 34th Street), wrote a piece entitled "A Populist Election and Its Aftermath," which appeared in the November 17 online edition of *Crisis Magazine*. While the whole thing is worth reading, I'd like to share the conclusion:

After the election, histrionics have abounded in academia. College campuses have long been breeding grounds for self-absorption and corruption of sense, or what John Henry Newman described in his "Tamworth Reading Room" letters as "a mawkish, frivolous and fastidious sentimentalism." A new name for these callow narcissists is "Snowflakes." This brings to mind the apologia of Mae West: "I used to be Snow White, but I drifted." Professors who never attained moral maturity themselves, reacted by providing "safe spaces" for students traumatized by reality. In universities across the land, by a sodality of silliness in the academic establishment, these "safe spaces" were supplied with soft cushions, hot chocolate, coloring books, and attendant psychologists. More than one university in the Ivy League provided aromatherapy along with friendly kittens and puppies for weeping students to cuddle. A college chaplaincy invited students to pray some prescribed litanies that offered God advice in an advisory capacity.

The average age of a Continental soldier in the American Revolution was one year less than that of a college freshman today. Alexander Hamilton was a fighting lieutenant-colonel when 21, not to mention Joan of Arc who led an army into battle and saved France when she was about as old as an American college sophomore. In our Civil War, eight Union generals and seven Confederate generals were under the age of 25. The age of most U.S. and RAF fighter pilots in World War II was about that of those on college junior varsity teams. Catholics who hoped in this election for another Lepanto miracle will remember that back in 1571, Don Juan of Austria saved Western civilization as commanding admiral when he was 24. None of these figures, in the various struggles against the world and the flesh and devil, retreated to safe spaces weeping in the arms of grief therapists. Yet pollsters ritually cite the attitudes of "college educated voters" as though colleges still educate and those who have not spent time in college lack an equivalent or even superior kind of learning shaped

by experience.

What will the frightened half-adults do when they leave their safe spaces and enter a society where there is no one to offer them hot chocolate during their tantrums? Christ formed his disciples in a more practical way: “I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves” (Matt.10:16). We are here today because those disciples did as they were told, and were not shrewd as snakes and innocent as doves. It is not racist, or any other unchristian form of phobia, to recall that the Apostles are Dead White Guys. If that was a liability, they managed well. Their Master, who wills that none be lost and that all be saved, was a Dead White Guy for just three days. That haunts those huddled in safe spaces and hallows all who court danger to follow him.
